It's time to make your **MEMBERSHIP PLAN**. Every Auxiliary should have a **Membership Committee**. This Committee should develop a Membership Plan. This Plan serves as a road map to *connect* all aspects of your membership: Recruitment, Orientation, Engagement, & Follow-Up.

- What should be included in the Membership Plan?
- How/when you will contact current and former members
- \checkmark When/where you will have recruitment events (try to hold at least 4 community events)
- ✓ How you will welcome new members;
- ✓ Assigning mentors for new members or existing members who want to learn something new;
- ✓ How/when dues notices will be distributed
- ✓ How to reconnect with disengaged members, etc.



When you post information about membership events on social media or you post pictures of membership drives/tables/recruitment efforts, use #vfwauxmembership and #vfwauxpamembership. This will help National and Department to easily find

your posts.



HOT OFF THE PRESSES: In an effort to make filling out the Membership Application easier, a revised version has been created (Revised May 2022). Take notice of the Letters along the left-hand side of the page. Before submitting am application, please make sure each applicable section is completed.

The applicant completes sections A, B, C or D and F and the Auxiliary completes section E. Just a reminder that a minimum of **two members** of the Investigating Committee must sign section E. You will find that a copy of the revised Membership Application is included in General Orders #2.

FRONT of Walker

BACK of Walker

To make this caddy you'll need

- Two pieces of fabric measuring 18" x 36". One of these should be a heavier weight fabric like heavy twill, denim, canvas, etc.
- Ties or ribbon I used ties made of bias tape sewn shut you'll need 1 1/2" yards
- 1/2 yard of sew on velcro

To start, cut your two pieces of fabric to 18" by 36"



With your sturdier fabric wrong side up, fold the two ends up as deep as you want the pockets to be. I made the pockets on one side 8 inches deep and 5 inches deep on the other side. Iron these folds so that you leave a crease in the fabric. Then, with pockets still pressed up, fold the fabric in half right sides together and press that fold as well.



Cut your tie ribbon into 4 equal length pieces. Using your pressed creases as a guide, lay your fabric right side up and pin the ties right next to the pocket folds, and pin the velcro about 3-4 inches to each side of the center fold.

Sew on velcro and ties.



Place your other piece of fabric right sides together with your tied/velcroed piece and sew around the edges, stopping with your needle down at the corners to turn and leaving an opening for your hand to turn this right side out.



Sew sides together, leave hole for turning Turn the caddy right side out. Press the edges and topstitch all around the edges, closing the hole you used to turn the caddy right side out. Then fold the pockets back up and stitch down sides, backstitching to reinforce the top edges of the pockets. Sew dividing lines on the pockets, backstitching at these top edges as well.

Fold up pockets and stitch in place

And then all that's left is to fold this caddy onto the recipient's walker, securing the velcro and the ties.







Auxiliary Outreach

(Formerly called Auxiliary Community Outreach) General Orders #2 August 2022

For years Auxiliaries were required to track **Community Service Hours Report (CSR)**. Although these hours are still important, they **should be reported to your Post Community Service Chairman**. In addition, they provide a **good resource to keep track of data for other Auxiliary Programs**. Keep in mind that there are **no CSR requirements for National Auxiliary Outreach Program awards**.

Auxiliary Outreach gives auxiliaries the opportunity to work with others to benefit children, the elderly, those with special needs, animals, the environment and public areas. It is important that at a meeting, a motion is made that when members volunteer their time with another organization, they are representing the VFW Auxiliary. Wear your Auxiliary t-shirt, pin, hat, etc. proudly to the event.

Get underway:

- Volunteer with First Responders to process Child ID Kits, assist with fire safety seminars, or CPR training. Partner with a community to host First Responder Appreciation Day.
- Volunteer with School Programs, Library Programs, Sports Clubs, Performing Arts, Scouts or other Youth Groups.
- Volunteer with Meals on Wheels, Home-bound meal delivery, Senior Center, Area Agency on Aging, drive seniors/disabled to doctor appoints, or assist with housekeeping/lawn care.
- Volunteer with Food Pantries, Food Banks, to sort, stock and distribute meals. Volunteer at Soup Kitchens, or Rescue Mission to sort donations, cleaning and maintenance.
- Volunteer at Animal Rescue Groups as dog walkers, animal care, sort donation, or cleaning. Volunteer to help Parks and Recreation Groups by planting trees or flowers.
- Volunteer with Red Cross, American Cancer Society, Heart Association, etc. to assist with registration, water stations, timekeeping, or parking.

Keep track of hours spent volunteering and the number of Auxiliary members participating! Remember one or a group of Auxiliary members can participate in events. Report monthly from April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023. Monthly Reporting form can be found on Department website under programs. Visit www.pavfwaux.org

Extension & Revitalization (Formerly called Chief of Staff/Extension Program)

The VFW National Organization has 5 requirements of an Auxiliary

- 1. Have at least 10 business meetings per year (Sec. 210) Five members in good standing constitutes a quorum (Sec. 212)
- 2. Dues should be paid on at least 10 members on or before Feb. 1 of the current year (Sec. 207)
- 3. Quarterly audits by Trustees must be submitted (Sec. 814)
- 4. Officers elected & installed & reported to National Headquarters no later that June 30 (Sec 804A & 806A)
- 5. The offices of President and Treasurer must be bonded (Sec. 814)

Mentoring for Leadership (Formerly called Chief of Staff/Extension Program)

Do you have a Mentoring Team? More than one person can mentor a new member. The Auxiliary Chief of Staff can put a Team together. Individuals can volunteer to sit with a new member, explaining the meeting proceedings. A different individual can be responsible for making a phone call to the individual, making sure they understood the Auxiliary meeting. We honor our Veterans when we are providing educational opportunities for ourselves and our youth, with **"Hands that serve, Hearts that care!"** So, let's begin!

Every competition has its own rules and regulations. Prior to any judging on the Department Level, chairmen evaluate the entries. Yes, we time the recordings, count the words, and measure or weigh the art before it ever reaches the judges! And unfortunately, that means we also must disqualify any entry not meeting the official rules established by National Headquarters. Please, **read the rules** for each contest!

The \$1,000 Continuing Education Scholarship – does not get delivered to the schools! It is only available to our members (who has been a member for at least one year) his/her spouse or their dependent child, who fills out the application and writes a short essay (one paragraph) describing how the scholarship will help them achieve their educational goals. The application and full instructions are available on MALTA.

The theme for the Voice of Democracy Audio Essay Competition is "Why is The Veteran Important?" and Patriot's Pen Essay for the year is "My Pledge to Our Veterans." To meet the deadlines, essays must be at the Post by Midnight, October 31, 2022. More details and the official entry forms for both scholarships are available on the VFW National Website.

Pennsylvania Voice of Democracy Teacher of the Year Award is given to one teacher who supports and promotes the Voice of Democracy Audio Essay Competition in their classroom. Entry forms are available at PA VFW Department Headquarters.

HOSPITAL AND VAVS PROGRAM

August is here and I hope you will make plans to join Pennsylvania's very own Department VFW Auxiliary President, Valerie DeCorte and members from across our great State, August 12-14, 2022 for the Program & Leadership Conference to be held in State College, PA. You will be able to meet the chairman, hear about the programs, learn and join in the fun things that are planned. So, get ready for a great weekend and please go onto the PA website for details (pre-registration, hotel information and agenda are available). Hope to see you there!!!

It's time to start "THINKING OUTSIDE THE BOX" - by participating in the <u>Pennsylvania</u> <u>Pouch Project:</u> This year's special project will be a pouch that can be made by our Auxiliary and/or VFW members; they will have pockets to hold any items the patient may have and that can easily be held on a wheelchair or walker with Velcro. A pattern is included with this General Order, or you can design your own, these can then be provided to local VA Hospitals, VA Centers, Nursing Homes, Hospitals etc. A citation will be given to any Auxiliary/VFW Post whose members participate in this special project. Get creative with the material you use, if you want to go above and beyond, think of a way to have a place they can put a name tag in case they misplace theirs. (When you deliver them, take a picture for your records, and provide a copy to us with your year-end reports). Some other ideas were to add a buddy poppy to a US flag and make an extra stitch to hold the flag firmly in an upright position.

HOSPITAL/VA FOCUS: This month we are focusing on Coatesville VA. Built in 1929 original mission was to provide neuropsychiatric care to Veterans. Coatesville VA has 302 operating beds, 148 residential treatment programs beds, 126 community living center beds and 28 mental health beds. In 2021 there were 204,654 outpatient visits and 1,237 hospital admissions.

Some things they do there: Play Bingo with the Veterans where prizes are canteen books, followed by snacks, pizza, etc. Have a picnic treating the Veterans with Burgers, hotdogs, potato & macaroni salads, and of course homemade desserts. Take the Veterans to baseball, hockey games, other outside sporting events.

Remember all the things Hospitals and VA Centers do, depends on your donations, so refer to the hospital donations list and send donations to PA Department headquarters, earmark hospital donations.

Every day we will **"Respect...Honor...Remember"** our Veterans and continue to assist our Veterans, families and our Communities with **"Hands that Serve, Hearts that Care."**
