# Recruitment Booth Pointers



#### What to Say

Practice what you'd say if someone came up to you and asked you what the VFW Auxiliary was about. An example is listed below.

You: "Hi, how are you today?"

Potential Member: "Good, thanks. What is the VFW Auxiliary/What does your organization do?"

You: "Have you heard of the Veterans of Foreign Wars - also known as the VFW?"

Potential Member: "Yes."

You: "We are the Auxiliary to the VFW; we support them in their efforts to assist veterans, active-duty military and their families.

Potential Member: "Wow. That's great!"

You: "We're active locally and nationally with nearly 4,000 Auxiliaries helping America's heroes in communities just like ours. (Hand them a flier at this point and say, "Some of the ways we offer support are"):

- By being a voice for veterans, locally and on Capitol Hill; we are instrumental in assisting the VFW pass or block legislation that impacts veterans and their families.
- · Assembling and mailing care packages to active-duty troops.
- · Holding send-off and welcome-home events for troops.
- Spreading the word about PTSD and military/veteran suicide awareness.
- Participating in Stand-Downs and assisting homeless veterans.
- Visiting veterans in VA Hospitals, Nursing Homes and Veterans Homes.
- Offering youth scholarships and educating youth about the American Flag.
- Spreading patriotism and educating our communities about America's patriotic holidays.
- Highlight other ways your Auxiliary offers support (i.e. holiday parties for children, sponsoring a local baseball team, delivering meals to shut-ins, etc.)

Let the conversation proceed from there!

#### DO'S

- · Wear an Auxiliary shirt and/or identifying name badge.
- · Smile and say "hello" to people when they walk by your booth - even if they don't stop!
- Stand to the side of the booth, or in front of the booth, and interact with people as they walk by.
- Look people in the eye when you speak with them.
- · Shake hands if appropriate.
- · Acknowledge and speak with others who are with them (spouse, parents, children, etc.).
- Give them a packet of information to take with them and ask them to share the information with others.
- Have at least two people working the booth.
- Ask them to join and hand them an application. Help them fill it out if needed.

### **DON'TS**

- Use profanity.
- · Smoke while at the booth.
- · Eat while at the booth.
- Talk or text on your cell phone while at the booth.
- Sit behind the booth with your arms folded in front of your chest.
- · Be overbearing or overly aggressive.
- Have more than two people talk to a potential member at once; it can overwhelm them.


Just as important is **Retaining** our current members.





It is the beginning of a new year. Do you know who your Representatives and/or Senators are? Which candidates are running for an office in November? Which of the Legislators will lobby Congress and the present administration to act on

the Legislative priorities and advocate on Veteran's issues? Do you know the answers, if not you can identify your congressional representatives by visiting VFW website at vfw.org/advocacy/grassroots-efforts? It is very crucial for the VFW and Auxiliary members to let their voices be heard on Capitol Hill.

First, I would like all the Auxiliaries to review the Priority Goals which can be found on both the National VFW and Auxiliary websites. This is my first promotion, for the Legislative Program to succeed. We need to review, relate, and advocate for the Veteran's benefits. Please send me your choice of legislation and the progress being made in Washington. Washington, DC allows the VFW to monitor all legislation affecting the Veterans, alert us to bills that are under consideration and to actively lobby Congress, President on Veteran's issues. You can find the specifics of a bill by visiting congress.gov, either by the number or by a key word or phrase. The goals are grouped under six areas of concern:

- Budget
- Health Care
- Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs
- Education, Employment and Transition Assistance
- Military Quality of Life
- National Security, Foreign Affairs and POW-MIA

Please have fun while advocating for our Veterans now and forever. It is our turn to watch over these men and women who have sacrificed so much of themselves for our freedom. Let's try to make it a lot easier for the veteran, active duty, and their families.

We belong to one of the greatest organizations, the Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars. We are not just a name but serve a purpose through the programs we sponsor and being there for Veterans, their families and our communities. Take a moment to reflect again on who you joined under, the why and remember you matter! We need your help in the Hospital Program, so I hope you have taken the time to read the Pennsylvania and National Program Books for 2022/2023 term and are already well on your way to participating, not only in the hospital program, but in each program we sponsor.

Each September I automatically think of 9/11 (Patriot's Day), a day that changed all our lives in one way or another. Not only do we remember all the lives that were lost, but those who still suffer. We owe so much to the men and women who serve in the Armed Forces fighting for our freedom, and as they grow older and depart this world to go to their heavenly home why not continue to show honor, dignity and respect to them. That is why I decided to remind everyone about the **Honors Escort** Program which is an opportunity to honor each veteran in a respectful and open manner and provides an opportunity for a veteran's family and friends, other veterans and medical facility staff to participate in a display of high regard and reverence for the individual at the time of death. A "**Final Salute**" of draping the veteran with an American Flag as they are taken out of their room while family, friends and staff show respect as they pass by is so moving. Gather the information about this program and go to your local Hospitals, VA Centers, Nursing Homes, or wherever Veterans may be cared for and help them get this program underway, they may need volunteers so please do. What a blessing you will be to those grieving.

<u>HOSPITAL/VA FOCUS:</u> This month we are focusing on Gino J. Merli Veterans Center (GMVC), located in Scranton PA which was established in 1994. GMVC has 196 beds, 290 dedicated clinical and professional staff, and many volunteers (last count in 2019 had 794 pre-covid). Naomi Woody, Representative and Cindy Lachovitz, Deputy do an awesome job seeing to the needs of our hospitalized Veterans.

Residents play cards and bingo, do puzzles, paint and crafts, have birthday celebrations that the residents help to plan and execute, plant flowers and vegetables in outdoor victory garden, enjoy picnics under covered pavilion and enjoy singing and watching plays put on by VFW and Auxiliary members. Veterans are transported to sporting events and local VFW Posts where they are treated to meals and honored. They enjoy parades and activities put on by a number of Community Service Based Organizations.

Hospitals and VA Centers depends on your donations, so refer to the hospital donations list and send donations through PA Department headquarters, earmark which hospitals you wish them to go to.

"Respect...Honor...Remember" our Veterans and their families with "Hands that Serve, Hearts that Care" and our communities will see what the Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars is about.

#### **Contest Eligibility**

- Open to students in grades **K-12** who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.
- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Student does not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate.
- Foreign exchange students and students aged 20 or older are ineligible.
- National grade division winners of previous Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue! students may
  enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a
  previous National winner.

# TIP for Historian/Media Relations – September 2022 Krístín DíGíacomo \*\*\*\*Avoid zooming in!\*\*\*

When you take a photo from a distance, it's tempting to zoom in on something specific you're trying to capture. But it's better <u>not</u> to zoom in — doing so can make the photo appear <u>grainy</u>, <u>blurry</u>, or <u>pixelated</u>. Instead, try to get closer to your subject — or take the photo from a default distance, and crop it later. That way, you won't compromise quality, and it's easier to play around or optimize a larger image. Remember to follow the Department of PA VFW Auxiliary on both Instagram (@pa\_vfw\_auxiliary) and TikTok (<u>www.tiktok.com/@pa\_vfw\_auxiliary</u>)!
