Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

The District visits are well underway, and I have enjoyed every stop so far. It's a humbling experience to meet the Veterans at the hospitals and centers that care for these heroes, to reconnect with members, meet many new members, visit areas I've never been to before, and to witness firsthand the dedication, compassion, and love our Auxiliary has for our Veterans and their families. Each visit is a reminder of why we serve this organization, and I carry the spirit of these moments with me as we remember that **"Every Day is Veterans Day."**

Several important resolutions were proposed and voted on during the VFW Auxiliary National Convention. A full recap can be found in MALTA under Member Resources, National Convention (about halfway down the page, look for the **2025 Adopted or Defeated Resolutions**). Highlights include:

- The reduction of the bond surety amount from double the amount of funds and property to 1.25 times the amount (effective next program year).
- A requirement that all monies collected for a special project must be forwarded to the designated recipient within the same fiscal year, unless otherwise specified.
- Updates to the Disciplinary Action process.

Please take a few minutes to download the document and share this valuable information with your members.

We have also been reminding Auxiliaries and Districts to complete their IRS 990-N e-postcard in the past two issues of General Orders. Thank you to everyone who has already filed and confirmed acceptance. For those who have not yet completed it, the deadline is quickly approaching. **Please don't delay.** Filing early is always best, as some Treasurers have reported challenges with the process. While some of these issues are easy to resolve, others have been much more complex. Timely filing ensures compliance and gives us the chance to assist if problems arise.

Finally, this is a friendly reminder that a lot of email messages are flying around asking for your assistance because we're "stuck in a meeting" or "can't talk" for one reason or another. There are way too many shady characters out there looking for people to respond because the recipient believes they are receiving the message from a legitimate sender. **ALWAYS** take a moment to verify the sender's email address because many fraudulent messages look official but come from unusual or incorrect accounts. If something doesn't seem right, **DO NOT** click links, share personal information, or act on their requests. When in doubt, contact the person directly through trusted channels: text, phone call, etc. - before responding to a random email you receive.

Please pay attention to the attached list of our VA Hospitals and Home; with special attention to the October 31 deadline for our **Christmas Canteen Fund**. ALL donations **must be** at Headquarters **no later than October 31, there are no exceptions.**

In support of this mission, to search out and qualify veterans in need of psychological healing through a service dog program; to evaluate the dog that the Veteran brings to the program for suitability to be a service dog; to provide qualified volunteer trainers and a training regimen in obedience, public access and tasks/work that the dog will perform in order to meet the individual needs of the Veteran; to provide a facility suitable for this training; and to have available on staff volunteer professional social workers to help the veteran deal with psychological issues which may arise as they work through the program.

Show Respect for Our Flag *A VFW Auxiliary Reminder*

The American flag is a powerful symbol of our nation and the sacrifices made by our veterans. During meetings and events, let's honor it properly with correct display and respectful practices.

Proper Display During VFW Auxiliary Meetings

- The U.S. flag is always placed to the speaker's right on stage or head table.
- No other flag should be placed above or to the right of the U.S. flag.
- The VFW Auxiliary flag should be placed to the speaker's left.
- The flag must never touch the ground.
- If displayed flat against a wall, the union (blue field) should always be at the top left as viewed by the audience.

Respect During Ceremonies

- Stand and face the flag during the Pledge of Allegiance, National Anthem, and opening/closing rituals.
- Civilians should place their right hand over their heart.
- Veterans and active-duty military may render a salute.
- Speak or sing clearly and proudly during the Pledge and Anthem.

The American flag represents the freedom and sacrifices we hold dear.

Treat it with the dignity it deserves.

What is Auxiliary Outreach?

- Auxiliary Outreach involves partnerships between an Auxiliary and other organizations to benefit the community through volunteer time, not monetary or in-kind donations.
- It can engage individuals of any age or ability and can support various groups, including youth, seniors, and animals, across diverse community settings.

Qualifying Activities

- Examples include volunteering at local events (e.g., walks, runs), collaborating with emergency services for training, participating in community beautification projects, and serving at food pantries.
- Activities must be voted on by the Auxiliary and should not benefit the VFW or Auxiliary directly.

Non-Qualifying Activities

- Efforts that support the Post or Auxiliary, such as fundraising meals, maintenance of the Post home, or church-specific activities, do not qualify as Auxiliary Outreach.
- Community service for veterans should be reported under Americanism or Veterans & Family Support, not Auxiliary Outreach.

Reporting and Recognition

- Auxiliary Outreach activities should be reported to the Department Auxiliary Outreach Chairman **Quarterly**.
- Your efforts will be rewarded with pins this year!

VFW-Based Veterans Assistance Programs

➤ The National Veterans Service (NVS) provides free assistance to veterans and families in accessing earned benefits through accredited Service Officers.

➤ The Pre-Discharge program aids military personnel in securing VA entitlements upon discharge.

➤ The Military Assistance Program (MAP) supports local military units, though financial aid for social events is no longer available.

➤ The Student Veteran Support Grant funds specific events for student veterans, while VFW Foundation Grants support community service projects, food relief, and building repairs.

➤ Donations for disaster relief are accepted at VFW National Headquarters to assist affected veterans and families.
