Without their service and sacrifice we would not have the freedoms we so easily take for granted. This program offers a way to bridge loneliness with care and compassion. Our Veterans can be blessed by the most precious gift possible – the sacrifice of your time. Your time is the most valuable contribution you can give.

**Volunteer Recruitment:** Why recruit? Volunteers fill the gaps between what is needed and what is wanted. **Volunteers Needed!**Because hospitals and homes cover only the basic needs. September has several important dates where you can have youth participate with your auxiliary. This is a great month to get the youth involved as school has just started and the fall sports have begun.


**September 11–Patriot's Day** is also known as the National Day of Service and Remembrance Day and it occurs on September 11. This is the day that we as a nation remember those who lost their lives in the terrorist attacks. If you sponsor a September 11 program, be sure to invite youth groups to assist you.

**September 17–Constitution Day and Citizenship Day** is the day that commemorates the September 18, 1787 signing of the Constitution of the United States. The founders were aiming to create a stronger central government while safeguarding individual rights and state powers.

**September 19–POW/MIA Recognition Day** honors and remembers our prisoners of war and those still missing in action for their commitment and sacrifice to secure our nation's freedoms.







**September 28–Gold Star Mothers'/Family Days honors our** mothers and family members who have lost a service member while in the line of duty. There are three different stars that categorize the soldier.

A blue star represents a family member who is in active service.

A silver star represents a family member wounded or injured in a war zone. A gold star represents a family member killed during active duty and stands for their sacrifices made for honor and our freedom.

These are great days to involve youth in your activities. Print out the **RAP** cards and hand them out to the youth that are helping you. **A little recognition goes a long way.** 

We want to make people aware that "Every Day is Veterans Day"and "From Sea to Shining Sea While Supporting Veterans" is what we do.
