THE JACK E. BARGER, SR. MEMORIAL NURSING SCHOLARSHIP FUND

INTRODUCTION

A Memorial Nursing Scholarship Fund was established at the 1989 VFW State Convention, held at King of Prussia, PA. This fund was in Memorial of Jack Barger, Sr., Department Commander, 1987-88, who passed away during his term of office.

POLICIES

Candidates for the award will be solicited through the Pennsylvania Nursing Association and its contacts with nursing schools in Pennsylvania. Chairpersons and deans of nursing schools will be asked to submit names of worthy candidates. The recipient(s) will be chosen by means of a lottery conducted by P.N.A. with the VFW State Commander and Barger Scholarship Chairman drawing the name(s).

There are two qualifications placed on the candidate(s) by the VFW: (1) the individual be a veteran or the son or daughter of a veteran; (2) be a resident of Pennsylvania.

HISTORY

A \$500.00 scholarship was awarded in 1990 and over the past 20 years the amount and number of scholarships awarded have increased to six (6) \$1,000.00 scholarships per year.

There have been various fund-raising efforts made over the years but the two main efforts have been requesting donations from VFW posts and auxiliaries and the Nursing Scholarship Golf Scramble.

FUTURE GOALS

Each year give six (6) scholarships. Increase the equity in the fund in order to make the fund self-sustaining. It is believed that an equity of approximately \$150,000 will be required.

With the help of the VFW posts and auxiliaries within Pennsylvania supporting the Golf Scramble by buying advertisements in the program book we will be able to increase the donation for the golf scramble to over \$10,000.00 each year. All money for advertisements in the Golf Scramble program book goes to the scholarship fund. Remember that none of this money supports the golfers participating in the scramble; however, they support the scholarship program.

Texas VFW Foundation Responds to Panhandle Wildfires

Texas VFW Foundation offers financial assistance to affected veterans and asks for public's help.

AUSTIN, TX, February 29, 2024 – The Texas Panhandle is currently experiencing the largest wildfire in Texas history with over one million acres consumed by fire and is less than 3% contained. The Texas VFW Foundation stands in solidarity with those impacted by these wildfires and offers support during this difficult time. We are extending more than just our thoughts and prayers.

The Texas VFW Foundation offers disaster relief and other programs to help Texas veterans in need. Disasters create such loss and suffering. We are committed to making sure Texas veterans have every resource available to them. The programs offered by the Texas VFW Foundation were developed by combat veterans and others to be able to respond with speed and empathy to address the most urgent needs: food, shelter, and security. However, we cannot do this alone.

The Disaster Assistance Program is a financial assistance grant for qualifying Texas veterans affected by a natural or manmade disaster. Awardees can expect up to \$500 per veteran household. This grant is a one-time grant and can be used for needs of the veteran during the disaster, such as replenishing food stores, hotel stays, vehicle fuel, and/or other expenses incurred during and immediately after the disaster.

In addition to the Disaster Assistance Program, qualifying applicants can apply for the Veterans' Assistance Program. This grant, funded in part by the Fund for Veterans' Assistance, can assist up to \$2,500 per veteran household for basic living needs such as rent/mortgage, utilities, vehicle payment, and/or auto insurance.

"The Texas VFW and the Texas VFW Foundation have been there for Texas veterans through the Bastrop fires, Hurricanes Harvey and Katrina, and the West fertilizer plant explosion," stated Beth West, Executive Director. "Each disaster brings different needs, yet they are similar. Displacement and loss occur each time. The Disaster Assistance grant is designed to assist with those immediate needs first and the Veterans' Assistance grant is to help pay the bills during and following the disaster. We can only assist when we have sufficient funds to do so. If you are not affected by these wildfires, please 'pass the ammo' and help those veterans who are."

Patriotic Instructor General Orders 09 March 2024

A question was asked recently regarding the propriety of a project in relation to the United States Flag Code. The project involved the removal of stars from the Flag before the flag is properly retired and giving the stars to our troops and/or veterans with an inspirational quotation. A better gift to our veterans and active-duty service members is to take the small parade flags and fold them in the traditional triangular, include that inspirational quotation and give the whole flag to our troops and veterans. That way the flag is maintained in its proper condition, and we are not gifting our troops and/or veterans a piece of a flag that should be properly retired in one piece.

Remember, when we gift that piece of the flag, there is no way that we can guarantee that those pieces of the United States Flag that are cut out will end up with a proper retirement and not just tossed in the trash. The best practice for managing the United States Flag would be to NOT mutilate or cut any portion of the Flag. According to the United States Flag Code, disposal is as follows: "The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning."

There was a similar question asked during a Programs Seminar at a previous National Convention. The Americanism Ambassador at that time shared a blog on the very topic. Here is a portion of that communication:

"Many well-meaning individuals have cut up soiled or worn Flags, sometimes cutting out stars and mailing them to our troops. Although this is a thoughtful gesture and appears on the Internet in several places, it is in fact, an inappropriate act and should not be conducted by any VFW Post or Auxiliary.

In August 2000, at the VFW 101st National Convention, delegates passed a resolution establishing a U.S. Flag disposal program by fire for VFW Posts to conduct, privately or publicly as follows:

- The Flag should be folded in its customary manner. (See VFW Ritual Book)
- It is important that the fire be sizeable and of sufficient intensity to ensure complete burning of the Flag.
- Place the Flag on the fire.
- The individual(s) can come to attention, salute the Flag, recite the Pledge of Allegiance, and have a brief period of silent reflection.
- After the Flag is completely consumed, the fire should be safely extinguished, and the ashes buried.
- Please make sure you are conforming to local/state fire codes or ordinances.

The resolution conforms to the intent and letter of the U.S. Code and the Federal Flag Code. This is the only acceptable way of handling U.S. Flags that are no longer in condition to be flown. No other handling of a retired Flag is considered acceptable. This issue has been reviewed by VFW National leaders and confirmed as the policy for the Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Auxiliaries."

We will continue to serve our veterans and their families as we "Let Freedom Ring" while we are "Banding Together for Our Veterans."

Listed here are the DO'S and DON'Ts reminders that you can do prior to the elections.
