LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM GENERAL ORDERS #5 NOVEMBER, 2023

We are well into our Auxiliary year so we should be going strong with our Legislative promotions. I have just taken over the chairmanship due to healthy issues with the previous chairman. I will be sending you informative information about bills that we need to support for our veterans as well as other legislative issues and facts.

By the time many of you read this, the election will be over and the winners will have been announced. Thank you to all of you who voted to voice your personal choices for our leaders.

I want to reemphasize the priority goals that the VFW and Auxiliary focus on. These priority goals reflect the resolutions passed by the VFW to strengthen and ensure an adequate VA system for all veterans (current and future.) These goals cover much needed help in veteran homeless and suicide, traumatic brain injuries and the backlog of claims, addressing veteran unemployment, and help with transition back to civilian life after discharge. The goals are grouped into six areas of concern:

- Budget
- Health Care
- Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs
- Education, Employment and Transition Assistance
- Military Quality of Life
- National Security, Foreign Affairs and POW-MIA

There are two bills out there right now that target two of the goals. They are HR4157 & S928 (not just a number act) states that we need to do whatever we can to prevent veteran suicide. The other bill is HR3933 & S2888 and that is to have a credited service officer on bases when soldiers are transitioning out of the military. Get in touch with your house and senate leaders and encourage them to sponsor these bills.

I will ask you every promotion letter to encourage your members, family and friends to join Action Corp. You only have to be 18 years old to do so. It is free and has tons of information about what is happening on Capitol Hill with regard to our veterans, service member issues and national security. Some posts encourage social members to join Action Corps when they join the post as a social member.

Remember that one of the reasons you joined the Auxiliary was to take care of our veterans and their families so what better way then to practice the above suggestions. **"Let Freedom Ring"** as we are **"Banding Together for Our Veterans."**
