We wanted to share the letter that our Commander and President wrote for the Fall 2024 edition of the PA VFW Newspaper.

VFW AND AUXILIARY ONE TEAM ONE FAMILY



We need to “Remember Our Mission” and The Importance of Working Together.

Our State Auxiliary President not too long ago, stood in the doorway of a meeting room, witnessing an exchange that deeply troubled her. A comrade and an Auxiliary member were engaged in a heated argument, exchanging unkind words with one another. Each of them, after the confrontation, came to her separately to explain their side. The comrade spoke of defending his family, expressing his frustration and need to protect his loved ones. The Auxiliary member, with tears streaming down her face, said, “We’re supposed to be here supporting veterans.”

At that moment, it struck her. Do they not see? The comrade is a veteran, yes, but this Auxiliary member is part of his extended family—the family we vow to protect and serve. And the Auxiliary member, though hurt, is also a part of this veteran’s life. They are bound by a shared mission, one that both of them seem to have lost sight of at that moment.

“One Mission, One Team”

It is easy to forget, in the heat of the moment, that we are all here for the same reason: to serve veterans, their families, and our communities. As members of the VFW and its Auxiliary, we commit ourselves to a mission of support and solidarity, and by doing so, we must recognize that we are a team—a family. We are all connected by this singular purpose.

When tensions arise, we must remind ourselves that we are stronger together. Veterans fought side by side, defending not just their brothers and sisters in arms, but also the freedoms and families they left behind. Auxiliary members work tirelessly to support veterans and their families, often making sacrifices that go unnoticed. We must never lose sight of the fact that both sides are essential parts of this effort.

“Recognizing Each Other’s Value”

The comrade who spoke to her was right—his family matters. But what he may not have realized in that moment is that the Auxiliary member standing before him is part of that family. Just as the Auxiliary member was right to say that we are here to support veterans, she also needed to recognize that the comrade she was upset with is the very veteran she is fighting for.

This isn’t just about our own personal grievances or individual perspectives. This is about something much larger—the collective mission we all share. Veterans are not just individuals; they are fathers, mothers, sons, daughters, spouses, and friends. And Auxiliary members are not just supporters—they are the family that continues to stand by their side, long after the battles are over.

“Finding Common Ground”

Disagreements are inevitable in any organization, especially one that deals with such emotionally charged topics as service and sacrifice. But in these moments of conflict, we must take a step back and remind ourselves of why we are here. Our mission is not just to protect our families, but to protect each other’s families. As we move forward, let this be a reminder of the importance of unity. The importance of Togetherness. The VFW members and the Auxiliary members are all pieces of the same puzzle. When we work together, we create a complete picture of support for veterans, military families, and our communities.

We must never forget that our strength comes from our unity, and that our differences should never tear us apart. VFW members and Auxiliary members are not opponents—they are partners in this mission. By recognizing each other’s value and working through our disagreements, we can ensure that we are providing the best possible support to those we serve.

Let’s refocus on what truly matters: our veterans, their families, and the communities we serve. United, we stand strong. Divided, we risk failing those who need us the most. Let’s commit to working together, with kindness and understanding, to achieve more for the ones we are here to serve.

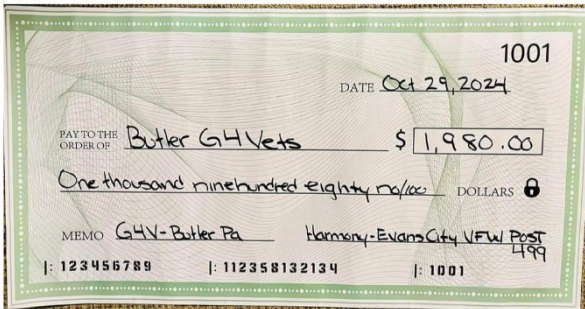

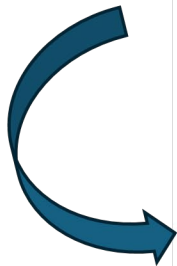

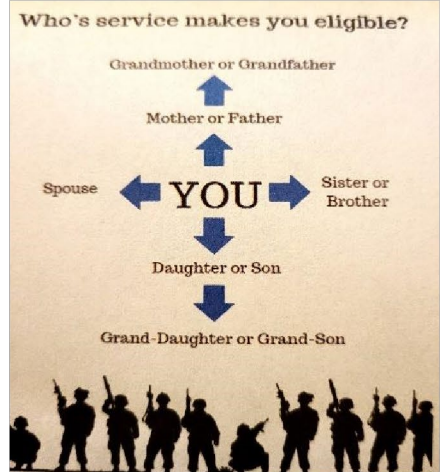

We are coming down to the wire..... November 5 will be here before we know it. Have you researched your candidates? Have you determined which candidates will make the best decisions for you, your family and our Veterans? We need to make our voices heard by being sure we vote on November 5, 2024.

Have you signed up for the Action Corps newsletter yet? It is a free subscription and provides a great deal of information on what is going on in Washington DC.

Pending Legislation in Washington DC

The VFW is very active in DC and this is a great way to stay in touch with what the VFW is working on for our Veterans. A few items in the Action Corps newsletter are:

H.R 7729, Dennis and Lois Krisfalusy Act: Will authorize the VA to provide headstone markers or burial receptacles for any eligible spouse or child buried in a national, stat or tribal veterans cemetery regardless of the date of death.

H.R. 8854, To amend title 38, Unites States Code, to authorize the provision of certain additional benefits for individuals for whom an urn or plaque is furnished and other purposes.

H.R. 8881, To amend title 38, United States Code, to permanently authorize the performance of Department of Veterans Affairs disability examinations by non-Department physicians pursuant to contracts, and for other purposes

Remember that Together Helping Veterans and From Our Roots to Our Branches, Extending Service to Our Veterans, No one does more for Veterans than the VFW Auxiliary!!!!!!!!!! Let's be sure we are heard.

If possible, please reward our students for their hard work by inviting them to your Post, having a dinner or pizza party, show them around your Posts. Explain what the Prisoner of War/Missing in Action table signifies, along with the history of your Post and what we do for our Veterans, their families, and our Communities. Maybe by doing so, we could have new members soon. Students who will age out of the Patriot's Pen contest need to be informed they are now eligible to enter our Voice of Democracy! VFW Auxiliary National Illustrating America Art Contest
An art contest for eligible students in grades K-8
2024-2025

The VFW National Auxiliary is pleased to present this National art contest to introduce, encourage and recognize young artists with patriotism through art. Entries will be judged on patriotic theme and technique.

Contest Eligibility

- Students in grades K-8 by the March 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.
- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Student does not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate.
- Foreign exchange students and students aged 15 or older are ineligible.
- National grade division winners of previous Illustrating America contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous national winner.

Contest Rules

- Students name, age and grade level must be printed on the back of art submission.
- Entry must be completed during the current school year.
- Entry must be two dimensional.
- Entry must be on canvas or paper.
- Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board.
- Reinforce the back with heavy paper.
- Do not frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass.
- Mats, including mounted and floating mats, may be used.
- Entries may not be smaller than 8" x 10" and not larger than 18" x 24", **INCLUDING** mat.
- Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, glitter, marker or other media may be used.
- If the American Flag is used, it **DOES NOT** need to conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors or numbers of stars and stripes.
- Complete contest entry form and submit with art entry.
- Parent or guardian signature required on contest entry form.
- Coloring sheets, digital art and photography and are **NOT** accepted.

Falsifying information on the entry form is reason for immediate disqualification. All contestants agree to abide by the contest rules. Any violation of these rules shall be cause for immediate disqualification and forfeiture of award.

- **March 31:** Student entries must be submitted to a participating sponsoring VFW Auxiliary.
- **April 15:** One winner in each grade division from each VFW Auxiliary advances to the VFW Auxiliary District (optional) then Department (state) for judging.
- **May 5:** VFW Auxiliary Department (state) winners in each grade division due to VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters.
- **July/August:** Students will be notified of entry status via email provided on entry form. First through third-place winners in each grade division named on VFW Auxiliary social media pages and displayed at the VFW Auxiliary National Convention.
- **September:** All art entries will be returned to address on entry form.

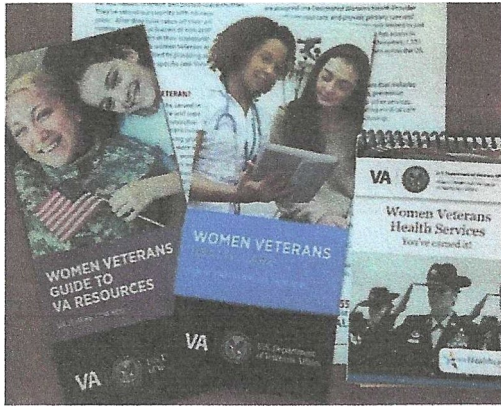

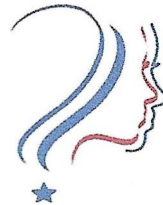
