GENERAL ORDERS #4 October 2023

**It's time to combat emotional stress** – many of our Veterans return home with heavy hearts and heavy minds. Life has its challenges and Veterans need to know they don't have to solve them alone. We can provide them with helpful resources for when they feel burdened with depression, isolation, grief and loss, disability and/or health challenges, financial challenges, life transitions and more. Let them know it's ok to reach out for guidance, assistance and most importantly for someone to be there for them.

**Veterans and their loved ones can Dial 988 Press 1** to connect with qualified and caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders 24/7. Visit <u>www.veteranscrisisline.net</u> and <u>www.va.gov/REACH</u> to learn the warning signs of suicide and information about VA mental health and suicide prevention resources.

**Be prepared.** There are resources and training for anyone who wishes to understand how to identify risks for suicide and what to do if you identify a Veteran at risk. **Learn about VA S.A.V.E. training.** S.A.V.E. stands for **Signs** of suicidal thinking should be recognized; **<u>Ask</u>** the most important questions of all – Are you thinking of killing yourself?; **<u>Validate</u>** the Veteran's experience; **<u>Encourage</u>** treatment and expedite getting help. #### HISTORIAN/MEDIA RELATION GENERAL ORDERS #4 October 2023

Are you wondering what you should include in your Historian book for your Auxiliary and/or District President? To be completely honest with you, there is no right or wrong answer to this question! I've been asked by several folks if there is a checklist of what to include, but at this time, there is no official checklist from National on what should be included in Historian books. I have listed below some suggestions on what you may want to consider including:

- A photo of your Auxiliary/District President along with the Auxiliary/District Number
- A list of all Auxiliary/District Officers and any Chairmen complete with photos and names
  - If it's a District Book, include the names and numbers of all Auxiliaries in the District along with the District President's name
  - Also include a list of the District meeting schedule with date, time, location and any scheduled District events such as fundraisers
- The first event in the book should be the nomination, election and installation of Auxiliary/District Officers, as that is when the Historian's year officially kicks off
  - If this is a book for the District President, you should also include the Installation of the District President at the Department Convention in June
- Keep a record of all that occurs during the year in <u>chronological order</u> and add photos and descriptions for each photo
  - Identify everyone in the photos (usually moving from left to right for groups)
  - All photos should have a label or caption
  - Make sure writing or typing is both clear and legible
  - If you have 4+ photos on the same page pertaining to the same event, be sure to label the top of the page with the event/activity name and the date
- Your Auxiliary/District President's year does not end until the following Department Convention where she receives her awards before going out of office

Again, these are just **suggestions** on what to include. Let your creativity shine through your work! Be mindful of how large you make your Historian book. It should be neat and concise while still giving its reader a full grasp on what your Auxiliary/District did over the year.

We should all strive to **"Let Freedom Ring"** as we continue **"Banding Together for Our Veterans"** today and every day!

Contact the Women Veteran Coordinator at your closest VA and you will find that they have information and pamphlets that are available free of charge that can be given and then distributed to VFW canteens, hair salons, libraries, wellness centers, etc.

*June 12 is Women Veterans Day.* Let's remember them on this day and every day. Our women veterans deserve that!


With this month being **TRICK OR TREAT** how about giving someone the **TREAT** of a life membership.
