**EMPOWERING HEROES: DONNA GEORGE'S DECADE OF DEDICATION WITH MILITARYSHARE**

Nearly ten years ago, the Duncansville VFW #8724 in Blair County partnered with Central Pennsylvania Food Bank to unveil the MilitaryShare program as its first distribution site. MilitaryShare is a food distribution designed to support veterans and their families. For the convenience and privacy of the individuals and families served, MilitaryShare distributions take place on-site at armories, VFW, and AMVET locations throughout the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank's 27 county service area.

Donna George has been with the program since day one, witnessing its incredible growth and building lasting connections. From its beginnings a decade ago, where it served 40 veterans and families, the program now supports over 345 individuals monthly. Donna has been a constant presence throughout this journey, introducing and guiding numerous volunteers with her unwavering dedication and fervor. Through her interactions with hundreds of families in her community, she has been profoundly touched by the program's impact, leaving a lasting mark on her heart.

One of the program volunteers recruited by Donna, Kaytee, exemplifies the extraordinary commitment to the cause by driving three hours one way to contribute her time. Donna reflects on the significance of the program, emphasizing that for many, "This is their groceries for the month; there are quite a few of them that wouldn't be able to make it without this service."

When Donna pauses to think about her why, it becomes evident that service is a family mindset. She volunteers alongside her veteran husband at the distribution, and both her father and grandfather are veterans of the armed services. "Our veterans are our heroes; more people need to serve them." Donna doesn't see a time when she won't be there, in all seasons, to help her neighbors in need. "I love doing this program; it gets tough at times, but we are always here."

Donna's dedication remains steadfast. She is unwavering in her commitment to providing nutritious food to our neighbors in need. This pioneer of care and compassion for our heroes is empowering change through servant leadership.

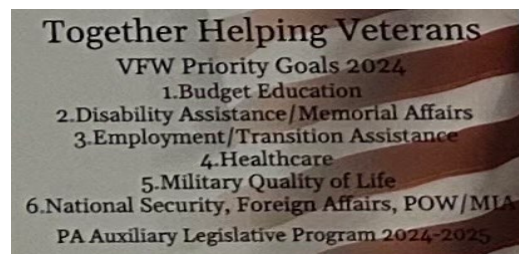
If you are not registered to vote please know that October 21, 2024, is the last day to register in PA for the November election.

National Suicide Prevention Week, which begins on September 8 and ends on September 14 this year, is an annual campaign observed in the United States to educate and inform the public about suicide prevention and to warn about rising suicide rates. It also aims to reduce the stigma surrounding suicide and encourage the pursuit of mental health assistance.

Assistance is a call, text, or a chat away. **For assistance 24/7, dial 988 and press 1 or text 838255.**

We each can play a key role in supporting our veterans who are struggling: Learn the signs of someone. Often there are changes in behavior, such as mood swings, angry outbursts, or loss of interest in activities they love.

**Reach out to someone who you think may be struggling** - Trust your gut if you are concerned. Ask directly if they have thoughts of ending their life – research shows this is helpful and does not put the thought in their mind. You do not need to be an expert to have a conversation. AFSP has developed [#RealConvo](#) guides with language to help you start and sustain conversations on mental health.

Back to school is in full swing for the kids! Time to start thinking about sponsoring youth events! With school back in and fall sports beginning, there are several ways to get involved with the youth in your area! Host a reading day for “Patriotism through Literacy” at the beginning of the school year to help kids’ brains get into gear for the school year. September is a great month to teach youth about Patriotism. Here are so ideas:

### **Patriot Day – September 11**

Patriot Day, also known as the National Day of Service and Remembrance, occurs on September 11 each year in memory of those killed during the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Those we lost on September 11, 2001, will forever hold a cherished place in our hearts in the history of our nation. Appropriate ceremonies and activities include a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 a.m. EDT, remembrance services and candlelight vigils. **Flags should be flown at half-staff on Patriot Day.**

### **POW/MIA Recognition Day – Third Friday in September**

POW/MIA Recognition Day is September 20, 2024. POW/MIA Recognition Day honors the commitments and the sacrifices made by our nation’s prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action. **National POW/MIA Recognition Day is one of the six days specified by law on which the black POW/MIA flag shall be flown over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices and military installations.** It would be a great time to make a formal presentation of the flag to the facility. **POW/MIA – YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN.**

### **Constitution Day and Citizenship Day – September 17**

This day commemorates the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787, by 39 delegates to the Constitutional Convention. This document established the framework of our government and the rights and freedoms that “We the People” enjoy today.

### **Gold Star Mother’s/Family’s Day – Last Sunday in September**

Gold Star Mothers and Family’s Day is September 29, 2024. Gold Star Mother’s/Family’s Day honors mothers and families who have lost a service member in in the line of duty or in support of military activities. The name comes from the custom of families hanging Service Flags in the window of their homes. The Service Flag has a star for each family member in the armed forces.

- A blue star represents a family member in active service.
- A silver star represents a family member wounded or injured in a war zone.
- A gold star represents a family member killed during active-duty and stands for sacrifice made for honor and freedom.

**These are great days to get those youth more zoomed in on being Patriotic!! Use your R.A.P. cards and Patriotic Youth Awards!!**
