Star Family Recognition: (You are encouraged to recognize these families in your area.) You may have noticed a Blue Star, Gold Star or Silver Star banner in the window of a home in your community. They are banners, approved by the Secretary of Defense, that family members of those serving in the United States Armed Forces may display.

- Blue Star Families can display a flag or banner with a white field and a red border, with a blue star for each family member serving in the US Armed Forces during a war or hostile period.
- Gold Star Families can display a flag or banner with a white field and a red border, with a gold star to represent a family member who died during military operations.
- Silver Star Families can display a flag or banner with a blue field and an outer red and inner white border with a silver star that represents a family member who was injured, wounded, or became ill as a result of combat.

- Patriot Day September 11th
- POW/MIA Recognition Day Third Friday in September
- Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day - Last Sunday in September
- Veteran's Day November 11th

The Department Americanism Chairman must sign and send a copy of the completed Department-winning entry form to the National Americanism Ambassador by April 30, 2024 for judging.

Citations will be mailed directly to winning Auxiliaries from National Headquarters and money will be deposited int Auxiliary account after National Convention.

- 2. Citation to each Auxiliary that hosts, or co-hosts with their Post, a Flag folding ceremony or a missing man ceremony. (MUST include photo and description with your end of year report.)
- 3. Citation to the Auxiliary in each membership division who best promotes a Patriotic holiday or any branch of service birthday within their community. (MUST include photo and description of event with your end of year report.)
- 4. Citation to the Auxiliary in each membership division that distributes the most American Flags.
- 5. Citation to the Auxiliary in each membership division that distributes the most POW/MIA Flags.
- 6. Citation to the Auxiliary with the best promotion pertaining to Flag education within their community. (MUST include photo and description of event with your year-end report.)
- 7. Citation to the Auxiliary with the best POW/MIA recognition or promotion. (MUST include photo and description of event with your year-end report.)

The Auxiliary Outreach Program is about the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary being in service with other organizations for the benefit of the community. It is a donation of time, not in-kind or monetary donations. Volunteer work can be performed by one member, a group of members or an Auxiliary to improve and show appreciation for the community in which we live and our pride as members of the Auxiliary. This is a great way for Auxiliary Members **"Banding together for our Veterans" to "Let Freedom Ring."**

Auxiliary Outreach can benefit children, senior citizens, and those with special needs as well as animals, the environment, and public spaces. When we participate in Auxiliary Outreach, we become better citizens of the community in which we live.

While emphasis is placed on our core VFW and Auxiliary programs, we realize Auxiliary members and Auxiliaries also participate with other community organizations. Auxiliaries can now report and be recognized for such community work through the Auxiliary Outreach Program. Projects may be done by the Auxiliary alone or with the VFW Post.

Collectively, all of our volunteer hours need to be counted to effectively show the importance of the local VFW and VFW Auxiliary to the community. Be visible and show your VFW Auxiliary pride by wearing Auxiliary branded attire – shirt, hat, jacket, name badge, etc. The Auxiliary emblem can spark a conversation about the Auxiliary and what we do. It is also a great way to show our members volunteering out in our communities and not just in our Post Homes.

What's Considered Auxiliary Outreach?

When an entire Auxiliary volunteers for an organization outside our own, it should be considered Auxiliary Outreach if **the project was approved by the Auxiliary and recorded in the meeting minutes prior to the project.** On rare occasions such as a national disaster or emergency community need, the project may be voted on after the fact. (When the entire Auxiliary volunteers and only one member is able to show up, it still counts as Auxiliary Outreach.)

- Participation in walks that benefit other organizations as an event spotter, water station volunteer, timekeeper, etc. (Walking or running in the race is not part of Auxiliary Outreach.)
- Working with local police on child ID kits
- Working with firefighters on fire safety and prevention
- Working with EMTs to host CPR training
- Working with parks and recreation departments to plant trees, adopt-a-park initiatives and develop community art installations
- Volunteering at an animal shelter
- Serving food at soup kitchens
- Delivering food or Meals on Wheels

What's NOT Considered Auxiliary Outreach?

- Volunteer work that is performed for the benefit of the Post or Auxiliary is <u>NOT</u> considered outreach service. Examples of projects that do not qualify include:
- Repairs/maintenance to Post home
- Cooking/serving meals for a Post/Auxiliary fundraiser
- "Buddy" [®] Poppy distribution
- VFW or Auxiliary meetings, Conventions, Conferences, or schools of instruction
- Church activities for one specific congregation and not the entire community (e.g., usher, elder, deacon, minister, etc.)

It is important that all partnerships with other organizations are approved by vote of the Auxiliary and recorded in your minutes. When member(s) volunteer their time for projects/programs of other organizations they are representing the VFW Auxiliary and should turn in their service hours to be reported for Auxiliary Outreach.

REPORTING GUIDELINES

- 1. The Auxiliary is to report on how many Auxiliary members participated, the number of hours volunteered and the activity/program they participated in.
- 2. Fundraisers are NOT considered for this service program IF organized by the VFW or VFW Auxiliary.
- 3. It is encouraged that you include written descriptions of community projects that were participated in by Auxiliary members, news articles, fliers, and photos.
- 4. A paper can be passed to members at your monthly meetings so that individual members can report what they have done.

Citations will be mailed directly to participating Auxiliaries from National Headquarters.

 Citation and \$25.00 to one Auxiliary in each of the four Conferences with the most outstanding community partnership. Entry form required and available in Malta Member Resources.

Citations will be mailed to winning Auxiliaries from National Headquarters and money will be deposited into Auxiliary account after National Convention.

DEPARTMENT OF PA AUXILIARY OUTREACH CITATIONS

- 1. A citation to the Auxiliary Chairman who submits a **REPORT EVERY MONTH.**
- 2. A citation to one District Chairman in each Membership Division with the best promotion of the Auxiliary Outreach Program. (Must send a written description to the Department Chairman)
- 3. A citation to one Auxiliary in each Membership Division with the most combined member and/or Auxiliary hours volunteered with another organization not affiliated with the VFW or VFW Auxiliary.
- 4. A citation to one Auxiliary in each Membership Division with the most outstanding community partnership with another organization. (Must submit a written description, photos, fliers, news articles, etc. to the Department Chairman.)

"Buddy" Poppy

The "Buddy" Poppy has been honored in the VFW Community for many generations. Known as the official memorial flower, the Poppy reminds us of the bloodshed and sacrifices made by American service members.

The Poppy movement was inspired by Canadian Army Col. John McCrae's famous poem, "In Flanders Fields". Overlooking the endless rows of graves each marked with a lonely white cross and surrounded by fields of poppies, Col. McCrae penned the poem in remembrance of the thousands who had fallen during the second battle of Ypres in Belgium.

Poppies were first distributed by the Franco-American Children's League to benefit the children of war-torn France and Belgium after WWI ended.

The first VFW poppy distribution was in 1922 just before Memorial Day. The VFW was the first Veterans' organization to do this nationwide. In 1924, the poppy flower became a registered trademark in the name of "Buddy" Poppy.

These subtle tiny flowers have made powerful impacts for the welfare of our Veterans and their families. A "Buddy" Poppy is not to be 'sold', but donations to the program are fundamental to our Veterans' needs, providing financial assistance over the past 95 years. Rehabilitation, services, essentials, and VFW National Home are supported through these donations!

The poppies still grow, the white crosses remain, and the poem echoes each year in our hearts. Auxiliary Members will be **"Banding together for our Veterans" to "Let Freedom Ring."**

ORDERING POPPIES & SUPPLIES

- Poppies may be ordered by contacting your VFW Department Headquarters or downloading the order form from the Department website. We suggest you request/order 8 to 12 weeks before they are needed to avoid delays.
- > This program requires a minimum purchase by each Auxiliary every year.
- Brochures, "Buddy" Poppy distribution supplies, and promotional items can be purchased from the VFW Store at vfwstore.org or calling 1-833-VFW-VETS

Distribution Tips

- Contact your city/town clerk's office to see if a permit is required at the location you would like to hold your distribution event. Obtain permission from the property owners/managers prior to your event.
- Share information of your location on websites, social media, newspapers, posters, etc.
- > Ask for assistance from youth groups, faith-based organizations, scouts, or JROTC.
- Share time and place with your members, ASK for volunteers, invite your Post & social members to join you. The more, the merrier! THANK YOUR VOLUNTEERS 3
- Ask volunteers to wear VFW or VFW Auxiliary branded clothing to promote the organization and connect the flower distribution to it.
- Remind volunteers that they are **NOT SELLING** but are **DISTRIBUTING** the "Buddy" Poppies for a donation. Use the manners momma taught you, *THANK* people.
- Please DO NOT refuse someone a flower for any reason. A "Buddy" Poppy honors veterans and everyone should be able to do so, just ask them to 'WEAR IT PROUDLY.'
- ▶ Use the "Buddy" Poppy Drive guide on MALTA for helpful tips and resources.

HONOR THE DEAD BY HELPING THE LIVING

- All proceeds from the Poppy drives are to be placed in the Relief Fund with receipts and expenditures in accordance with the Treasurer's Guide, Bylaws and Ritual
- "Buddy" Poppy drives can be ANY time of the year, try something once a month or quarterly if you have enough time and volunteers.....don't be shy, GIVE IT A TRY!
- > Use/Display poppies everywhere and anywhere! Use your imagination for all events!

National and Department "Buddy" Poppy Display Contest

- 2. **Memorial or Inspirational Displays** Wreaths, memorial tables, plaques, patriotic or devotional themes.

VFW National Home

The VFW National Home is a place where Military Veterans and their families can get a fresh start by living rent free for up to four years and have access to case management services, life skills training, tutoring and other educational services as well as recreational and community services needed to aid the healing process. It provides a safe and peaceful environment for the entire Veteran's family.

The 42 single family homes, grounds and facilities are supported by sponsorship.

Department of Pennsylvania VFW Auxiliary sponsors Cottage #3.

The Health and Happiness Fund is a critical resource for VFW & Auxiliary donations.

On January 7, 1925, the VFW National Home was founded in Eaton Rapids, Michigan. The original goal was to help families left behind by war remain together when their military loved ones didn't come home. National Home serves as a living memorial to veterans by helping our nation's military and their families during difficult times.

The spacious campus includes tree lined streets with family homes, playgrounds, parks, childcare facilities, community center, multiple family-oriented facilities, a guest lodge, chapel, administrative offices, and indoor/outdoor recreational opportunities.

National Home is forever evolving to meet the changing needs of Veterans and Military families to better assist them with reintegration, PTSD, unemployment, rehabilitation from battlefield injuries, emotional wounds, financial stress, or fractured family relationships, among other issues that can affect anyone serving our country and his family or her family. Partnering with the home's staff/volunteers in helping the family to reach their full potential.

Extension and Revitalization

The extension and revitalization program is designed to maintain and strengthen current Auxiliaries, recognize Auxiliaries having difficulties and encourage unaffiliated posts to establish new Auxiliaries and encourage constant communication.

Auxiliaries experience challenging times such as suspension, consolidation or even the loss of their Auxiliary. The Department Chief of Staff, District Chief of Staff, District Presidents and the Department President must work closely with these Auxiliaries to help support and maintain them.

There are resources and tools available in the Online Academy and in Malta under Member Resources. Resources are valuable tools in helping an Auxiliary be more productive. There are Seven (7) resources that can be used to identify and solve issues:

- 1) Healthy Auxiliary Check list
- 2) Healthy Auxiliary Member Questionnaire
- 3) Auxiliary meeting clinic
- 4) Communication phone/text tree
- 5) Good job certificate
- 6) Healthy Auxiliary certificate
- 7) VFW Auxiliary mentoring guide

Building on the VFW Auxiliary foundation educates members on the duties of officers, how to be a chairman and explains why reporting is required.

A Chief of Staff must be patient, listen, understand and show compassion. These are vital tools in solving problems. A Chief of Staff needs to utilize a "one size does <u>not</u> fit all" plan. We need to ensure that Auxiliaries are conducting business in a way that works for them and that their members feel empowered and engaged. The Department Chief of Staff and the District Chief of Staff should work together.

A District President or assigned representative must be honest in their assessment of an Auxiliary during their annual visit. If the Department President doesn't know that an Auxiliary is in trouble she cannot help.

Auxiliaries must maintain the five (5) essentials required by the National Organization to keep their charter.

1. Auxiliaries must have at least ten (10) business meetings per year (Sec. 210). Five (5) members in good standing of that Auxiliary shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. (Sec. 212).

2. Dues should be paid on at least ten (10) members on or before February 1 of the current year (sec. 207).

3. Quarterly Audits by Trustees must be submitted. (sec.814)

4. Officers elected, installed and reported to National Headquarters no later than June 30. This generates the bond application via email (Sec. 804A and 806A).

5. The Offices of President and Treasurer must be bonded by August 31.

Establishing New Auxiliaries

Whether a VFW Post decides on its own that it wants an Auxiliary or whether an Auxiliary member or non-member sees the potential for a new Auxiliary, the steps for creating an Auxiliary are the same.

- 1) A VFW Post must vote by 2/3 majority to have an Auxiliary. An Auxiliary can never exist on its own without a VFW Post and can never be started without the VFW's permission.
- 2) The Department President appoints the official organizer of that Auxiliary. He/she must be an Auxiliary member.

When making a presentation to an unaffiliated post, choose a person who is positive and knowledgeable to speak with the Commander of the Post. Request permission to speak with the post membership. Let them know how having an Auxiliary will benefit the VFW Post. It would help to allow two others who are knowledgeable with Auxiliary business and who work well with others to be on an organizing team. They can assist with training, educating, and mentoring the new Auxiliary. It is recommended that the organizer and team remain with the Auxiliary for at least one year or until they are ready to proceed as an Auxiliary without their guidance.

A minimum of 15 eligible applicants must be on the charter application. Transfers are accepted at the close of the institution and just prior to the installation of the newly-formed Auxiliary.

The Department Chief of Staff would assist by providing the following tools to the organizer and the organizing team:

- Talking points for the first meeting.
- A procedure for membership applications.
- When and how to collect dues.
- Assist in securing and filling out official and proper paperwork.
- See that deadlines and filings are met in a timely manner.

For more information on this topic, see Article II of the VFW Auxiliary podium edition: Bylaws and Ritual.

Suspensions, Cancellations and Consolidations

An Auxiliary is in danger of losing their charter when they are unable to meet the five (5) essentials of an Auxiliary. Suspensions are used in certain cases to give Auxiliary members a chance to fulfill their duties and continue to become a healthy Auxiliary again. When an Auxiliary is placed on suspension it is not negative or labeled as a bad thing. it simply means that there is some work to be done to get your Auxiliary where it needs to be. The Department President will appoint a team to mentor, educate and listen so your Auxiliary can get back to being a healthy Auxiliary.

Cancellations can only be done by the National President with or without the recommendation of the Department.

If a VFW Post closes or consolidates, Auxiliary National Headquarters will be notified. ONLY AFTER THIS NOTIFICATION can the process for closing or consolidation begin.

The notification from National Headquarters will allow ample time to close, move members to their desired working Auxiliary or consolidate where the Post goes.

Tradition and history are revered in our organization. There are many Auxiliaries that proudly celebrate 100 or more years of history. Many of our members treasure long-standing rituals and practices. Unfortunately, it's becoming increasingly common that some of our Auxiliaries do not necessarily share this type of enthusiasm or have members wishing to join an Auxiliary that does. Thus arises a conundrum: Can we retain our traditions while also attracting the new members necessary to keep the Auxiliary a strong, vibrant and relevant organization?

Service is more than something we do; it's who we are. The work of the Auxiliary is important, and by sharing our stories, we are doing our part to promote the Auxiliary in our communities.

Be sure that you remember to be both mindful and respectful before you #SNAP (Stop Now Ask Permission) a photo. Carry around some of the youth and adult photo releases available in MALTA Member Resources. Releases help protect both the photographer and the person(s) being photographed, especially children. For various reasons, it's important to have permission to take someone's photo.

Remember, photography opens doors into the past while also allowing a look into the future. A camera is a SAVE button, so let's SAVE our history. Let your Auxiliary legacy members become STARS, for without our STARS, our Auxiliary would not exist. This Program Year, connect with a legacy member and complete a three- to five-minute video interview:

- Ask why they joined.
- Ask about their favorite memorable moment(s).
- Place emphasis on bringing the past to life.
- If your Auxiliary has no legacy members, look to your District.

HISTORIAN DUTIES • MEDIA RELATIONS

Our Historian & Media Relations members are responsible for capturing the narrative of the Program Year. They are our <u>memory keepers and collectors</u> of the 5W's: the **who-what-where-when-and-why** of your Auxiliary. But these members aren't just responsible for taking photos; there's so much more that is involved with this Program, including compiling, chronicling, and sharing events and memories in both written and digital format through photographs, memorabilia, audio/video clips, print news

and social media posts! Our Historians & Media Relations Chairmen promote the Auxiliary through media, Post/Auxiliary newsletters, websites and other media available to them.

MEDIA

At the Auxiliary, District and Department levels, these members are the voices that get the word out about our Auxiliary to our communities! As our Auxiliary grows, we must continue to reach out to both members and non-members to tell the story of who we are, what we do, how we help our veterans and to educate others about our nation's patriotic traditions. Without our storytellers, fewer people will know about our organization and how we raise money for our veterans and their families, how we fight for our veterans' rights and how we support our young people with scholarships and various other opportunities!

Media is an essential piece that creates a successful Auxiliary. It's imperative that we communicate with **both** our traditional media outlets as well as our digital, social media outlets. A great place to start is MALTA Member Resources. There are many resources there, everything from the basics to setting up a Facebook page for your Auxiliary. And while social media may seem scary or intimidating, don't allow that to become an excuse. This is a wonderful way to involve another tech-savvy member of your Auxiliary, or a family member or student who can assist you in learning how to navigate and utilize these new forms of digital media. Be willing to learn new ways to preserve your Auxiliary's memories!

Get to know your local newspaper, radio and television reports. Send information directly to those contacts rather than the editor. Send a personal email and be sure to include your personal contact information.

HISTORICAL RECORDS at ALL LEVELS

It's very important to keep written reports and photos of our history at all levels of our organization. Consider how great it is to have the ability to look back at years gone by and see what took place in your Auxiliary or District.

Nowadays, there are multiple ways to keep records and photos, such as a digital photobook/scrapbook, a traditional photobook/scrapbook, or a three-ring binder. And make sure to

include any newsletters, fliers, or other mementos as well! Lastly, always be sure to keep the records in chronological order.

I would urge each Historian, at all levels, to write down what's happening, take as many photos as you can and always include a description. Also, you can always check MALTA Member Resources for more information.

QUICK TIPS

Remember, all photos should be clear and sharp, digital photos should be at least 1 MB (megabyte) in size, and all photos should be taken with attention to detail. Be sure to avoid the following:

- Subjects with closed eyes
- Subjects with open mouths or food in their mouths
- Awkward or distracting objects in the frame
- Offensive language on clothing

Please note that the reporting year for this program is Department Convention 2023, when your President is installed, until Department Convention 2024, when the new President will take office.

The deadline for all pictorial History Books will be <u>April 6, 2024</u> for judging. All Auxiliary submissions can be turned into their District President to be hand delivered to the Department Historian at the Madam President's Testimonial Weekend or sent via regular mail.

 - d. Be prepared by making your presentation brief, clear and concise.
 - e. Focus on the issue.
 - f. Send a Thank You note to the Legislator and their staff for taking time to discuss your concerns.

Legislators want to hear from you. The most important part of communicating with your legislator is to just "do it."

Things your Auxiliary Can Do to support the legislation, which is important to our Veterans, Service member and families:

- a. Attend Town Hall meetings.
- b. Set up Voter Registration Drives/Push the Vote Campaign on the local level.
- c. If possible, provide carpool service on Election Day for disabled or elderly so that they can vote.
- d. Support and work for your favorite Candidates.
- e. Do wear clothing/pins with the VFW Auxiliary Emblem at public events such as Town Hall, rallies, forums and/or debates.

Things not to do include:

- a. Do not endorse candidates on behalf of the VFW Auxiliary National Organization, Department, District or Auxiliary.
- b. Do not wear your Auxiliary Cap when actively campaigning, soliciting donations or knocking on doors asking for pledges for voting for candidates.

It does not matter which candidate you are supporting, as long as they understand that you are a VFW Auxiliary member and you are concerned about our veterans, families and military personnel.

Lights: To Invite & Recruit

Our talent scouts should be **Recruiting** up-and-coming new members to accomplish the Auxiliary mission. Let's keep scouting for talent in all our new members that we have Recruited. Seasoned members can help new members by helping them discover their talents that can help the organization in their programs. It is up to you to invite more Auxiliary members to get involved by becoming talent scouts for our new and upcoming new actors.



Camera: Include Everyone

Remember, all ideas are important and may need editing for the final cut. Everyone has different strengths, skills and encourages them in the program that fits them. Follow Up: New Members and Rejoined Members

To begin the production of a new show you need a read-through with the cast. This is why it is so important to follow up with new and rejoined members. Before the first meeting see if you can meet and answer any questions about the meeting and Rituals that might help them through it.

Promote: Have a Plan


Every Auxiliary should have a Membership Plan. This Plan should have the following:

VOICE OF DEMOCRACY AUDIO/ESSAY CONTEST 2023 - 2024 Theme: "<u>What are the greatest attributes of our Democracy?</u>"

This contest was created to give high school students a forum to express their opinions by creating an essay on a specific theme, then recording the essay as a speech. Sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars since 1947, the Auxiliary is in partnership with the comrades to promote and encourage youth participation in their premier Scholarship program.

The Voice of Democracy Audio/Essay Contest is open to students in grades 9-12 by October 31, 2023. Students can be enrolled in public, private, parochial high school, or an approved home study program in the United States, its territories or possessions, or dependents of U.S. Military or civilian personnel in overseas school. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawfully U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application of which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign Exchange students, students aged 20 or older, previous 1st Place Department Winners, GED or Adult Education students are ineligible.

Students are required to write an essay offering their opinion on the specific theme, and the student must be the sole author of the essay. The essay is then recorded on a flash drive. Please note that CD's are no longer accepted. The recording of the speech is to be in the student's own voice and in English. No music, singing, poetry, sound effect, or background noises are permitted. The essay must not identify the student in any way, (including but not limited to name, school, city, state, race, or national origin,) although the recording and typed essay should be labeled with the student's name to show ownership. The recording is limited to between 3-5 minutes (+ or -5 seconds) in length.

The entry application, flash drive, and a printed copy of the essay are then submitted to the local VFW for judging. Judging is done on the recording. District level winners are required to submit a head and shoulders photograph along with their entries. This competition is provided for all students in 6th-8th grades by October 31, 2023, enrolled in a public, private, parochial school, or an approved home study program in the U.S., its territories, or its possessions. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residency (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign Exchange students, students aged 20 or older, students who previously placed in the National Competition, GED and Adult Education students are ineligible. Please download the complete rules and official entry form at: <u>vfw.org/community/youth-and-education/youth-scholarships</u>

All essays must be the contestants original work and a product of the contestant's own thinking. The approach to the essay's theme should be positive and focused. Poetry is not acceptable. Quotations may be used sparingly, and plainly identified wherever used. Parents, counselors, or teachers may check the essay for punctuation, grammar and/or spelling, but the content must remain the contestants!

Essays should be 300 – 400 (+ or – 5 words) and typed in English. (Every word counts regardless of length, excluding the title and footnotes.) The essay must not identify the student in any way, (including but not limited to name, school, city, state, race, or national origin.) Graphics and color are not permitted on the essays. Only White 8"x11.5" paper for printing. **DO NOT PUT A NAME, GRADE, or DATE on the essay.** The completed Entry form is your cover page. District level winners will be required to submit a head and shoulders photograph along with their entries.

The essays and application forms are submitted by the schools to the VFW Post for judging. Each VFW Post may sponsor 1 entry for each 15 entries or a part thereof, to advance to the District Level of judging. One winner from each District advances to the Department judging, and one Department winner advances to the National finals.

Citizenship is not required, they must be lawful U.S permanent resident (the application for which not denied) and they intend to become a U.S. Citizen. Foreign exchange students, those over age 20, GED and adult education students, or previous winners of the Patriotic Art Contest are not eligible.

Artwork may be done with oils, watercolors, pencil, pastels, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylics, markers, pen-and-ink, or any other media. Artwork must be on stretcher frames, canvas or paper and may not be smaller than 8" x 10", nor larger than 18" x 24" excluding mat. Do not frame entries! Entries not on stretcher frame or canvas board may be matted with only white matboard, and must be reinforced with heavy paper or cardboard on the back so it does not bend. Mounted/floating matting is permissible, **but must be white**. If the American flag is shown in the art, it must conform to the Federal Flag Code. Entries are judged on the Patriotic theme and technique.

Students shall submit their artwork with an entry form and a brief description of the patriotism being expressed in the artwork. (150 words or less, typed, and in English.) Both must be securely attached to the back of the art. Please download the fillable entry form on MALTA. Complete rules are available at: <u>vfwauxiliary.org/scholarships.</u>

3-DIMENSIONAL ART CONTEST

The 3-Dimensional Art Contest promotes Patriotism while recognizing young artists in grades 9th-12th. The contest accepts three-dimensional art that can be paper, papier-mâché, pottery, sculpture, metal, wood, fabric, etc. (See the official rules for art forms that are allowed.)

The competition is available to 9th-12th grade students, enrolled in a public, private, or parochial school, or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. Military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. The maximum age of the student at the time of entry is 19. While US Citizenship is not required, they must be lawful US permanent resident (the application for which not denied) and they intend to become a U.S. Citizen. Foreign exchange students, those over age 20, GED and adult education students, or Previous winners of the Patriotic Art Contest are not eligible. The student must attend a school in the same state as the sponsoring Auxiliary, but is not required to be a VFW/Auxiliary member or a relative of a member.

Pieces should be no smaller than 8" and no larger than 18" in any direction. Art cannot weigh more than 5 lbs. Digital art, photography and jewelry are not eligible.

Students shall submit an entry form and a brief description of the patriotism being expressed in the artwork. (150 words or less, typed and in English.) Attach both to the artwork.
